





Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

The CDBG program provides annual grants on a formula basis to entitled communities to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment, and by expanding economic opportunities, principally for low to moderate income persons.

Selecting Projects

Must meet a *national objective* that requires benefits to low and moderate income persons, prevents or eliminates blight or other urgent community development need. *Examples*:

Eligible Activities:

- acquisition of real property;
- rehabilitation of structures;
- construction of public facilities;
- streets,
- neighborhood centers,
- public services; provision of assistance to profit-motivated businesses to carry out economic development and job creation/retention activities.

Ineligible Activities:

- acquisition, construction, or reconstruction of buildings for the general conduct of government;
- political activities;
- certain income payments; and
- construction of new housing by units of general local government.

Project Priority

<u>Streets/Sidewalks/Trails/Streetlights (infrastructure)</u> – Fund infrastructure related mobility including sidewalks, trails, streetlight improvement, roadways additions and/or barrier removals in areas defined as low-moderate income or related to senior activities

<u>Programs</u> – Park and Recreation Scholarship Program; provide scholarships to 100 low-moderate income children annually to participate in Pfun Camp or other related Parks and Recreation Program



Action Plan

- ✓ Specifies the actions to address the needs identified in the Consolidated Plan
- ✓ Concise summary of the action, activities and resources to be used each year
- ✓ Submitted annually and upon amendment





2020 Project Priority

<u>Infrastructure</u> – Fund approximately \$243,995 in infrastructure projects that are in areas defined as low-moderate income.

<u>Programs</u> – Park and Recreation Scholarship Program (\$20,000/year); provide scholarships to 100 low-moderate income children annually to participate in Pfun Camp or other related Parks and Recreation Program






Yellow Sage/Parkway Area Roadway Improvements
