The 2017 Maker Pfest welcomed artists and crafters of all types. Guests included Austin Area Rocketry Group Daniel G. Benes Science Shows The Robot Group Central Texas Woodturners' Association, ATX Hackerspace, Chick Tech Austin, Pflugerville Quilt Guild, Carol Teitelman's Knitting Station, Bot Party, Suga's Cakery, Colorful Exploration by Jacky Cardenas, Pflugerville Library Girls Who Code group. More than 900 people enjoyed crafts and hands on demos including staff lead demonstrations.



Heritage House featured "Citizens at Last," a traveling exhibit focused on the twenty-seven-year campaign for woman suffrage in Texas. The first stage of restoration and repairs to the house were completed June 30th. Work included foundation leveling, sheetrock repair, interior painting and HVAC repair and venting upstairs.

The Juneteenth event for this year featured LaToya Devezin, African American Community Archivist at the Austin History Center, on the history of Juneteenth and African Americans in Travis County. The program, held at the Heritage House Museum, attracted more than 30 participants.



The children's department has partnered with Give Me an A Literacy Project this summer. The Give Me an A Literacy Project is a reading program that uses a creative approach to achieving literacy skills by incorporating multiple genres of English and Language Arts. The program focuses on learning the fundamentals of reading and writing to establish reading comprehension and reading fluency in emerging readers.



Youth programs this summer include the DiversiTeen Lunch Bunch. Teens eat lunch and talk about books with other teens. The club celebrates diversity and promotes inclusion. Teens discuss books featuring diverse characters and experiences.
