



**MAYOR'S PROCLAMATION DECLARING
JUNE 19, 2026 AS JUNETEENTH
IN THE CITY OF PFLUGERVILLE**

WHEREAS, on June 19, 1865, Union Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas and issued a general order announcing that all enslaved people were free in accordance with the Emancipation Proclamation; and

WHEREAS, this day, known as Juneteenth, marked the final enforcement of freedom for more than 250,000 enslaved African Americans in Texas; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth has been celebrated for more than 150 years as a time for reflection, remembrance, and rejoicing, honoring the strength, resilience, and cultural contributions of African Americans across generations; and

WHEREAS, we recognize that the promise of freedom requires ongoing commitment, shared responsibility, and continued work to advance equity, opportunity, and understanding for all residents; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth stands as a reminder that freedom is both a historic milestone and a living obligation, one that calls communities to learn from the past, uplift one another in the present, and build a more just future together.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that I, Doug Weiss, Mayor of the City of Pflugerville, Texas, do hereby proclaim June 19, 2026 as Juneteenth in the City of Pflugerville.
