Scope of Work

This feasibility study included evaluating multi-use fields for football, soccer, cricket, baseball, softball, and other amenities taking into account appropriate field sizes for various age groups. Public engagement played a critical role in this process. Parkhill analyzed community feedback from the recently-completed public outreach efforts completed in the 2023 Parks, Recreation & Open Space Master Plan. Parkhill then conducted five additional stakeholder meetings to further assess community sentiment and specific concerns regarding the growing demand and lack of field-based facilities.

Following this, Parkhill developed a comprehensive Field Program outlining recommended facility types, sizes, and age group accommodations. This program was created in collaboration with city officials to prioritize field development based on agreed-upon criteria. A site suitability study was conducted, using GIS analysis to evaluate potential locations for new fields based on topography, transportation access, utility infrastructure, and equitable distribution across the city. The study resulted in a map and a list of recommended parcels, including existing city-owned land and potential properties for acquisition.

This feasibility study also includes an Opinion of Probable Construction Cost for each proposed facility and a total in five year increments starting in 2025. A cost-benefit analysis comparing natural grass and synthetic turf options, along with long-term operations and maintenance costs is included for order of magnitude considerations on field surfacing. These findings are projected in a 20-year Capital Improvement Plan that accounts for inflation and provides a roadmap for addressing the city's recreational field needs.

The project included key in-person meetings: a kickoff and inventory meeting, current field assessment tour, five stakeholder sessions, a presentation of draft recommendations, and a final presentation. Additional meetings were conducted virtually. The goal of this study is to equip the City of Pflugerville with the information and planning tools needed to systematically close the gap in athletic field availability and growing demand for these services.



Need for Facilities

The City of Pflugerville is currently experiencing a significant deficiency in athletic recreation fields, with only 33 acres available to meet an immediate 55 acre demand for athletic fields. To address this 22-acre shortfall, the City sought a feasibility study to assess existing facilities, evaluate current and projected demand, and identify immediate and long-term needs. The study serves as the basis for a 20-year Capital Improvement Program aimed at expanding and improving athletic field infrastructure to meet the needs of the rapidly growing city.



National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) Report

The National Recreation and Park Association's 2025 Agency Performance Review provides nationwide benchmarks for park and recreation agencies. The data, drawn from over 900 agencies, helped offer a baseline for evaluating whether the Pflugerville parks system is providing enough sports facilities at the national standard. Figure 3 provides the median number of residents per facility based off of the City's population. This report guided this study to determine what facilities need to be provided in the future.

The table to the right is the NRPA's findings expressed as the percent of agencies with the specific amenity in their park and recreation system in the first column. The following seven columns represent a ratio of one facility type per population served based on national benchmarking. For example, 94% of all agencies surveyed provide playgrounds. The total average is one playground per 3,737 persons in a population served. For a city with a total population of 50,000 to 99,999, the national benchmark is one playground per 3,643 persons in the population served.

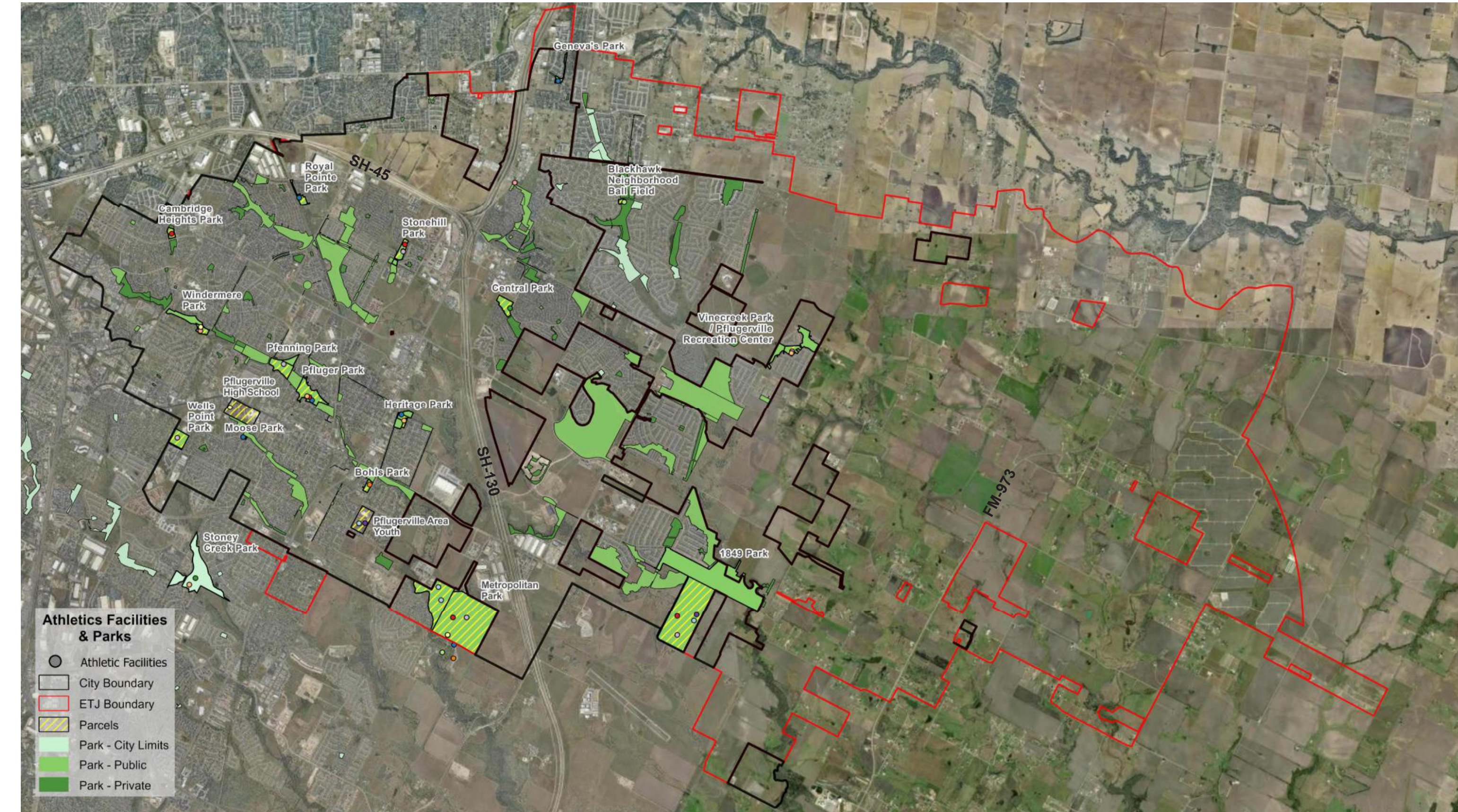
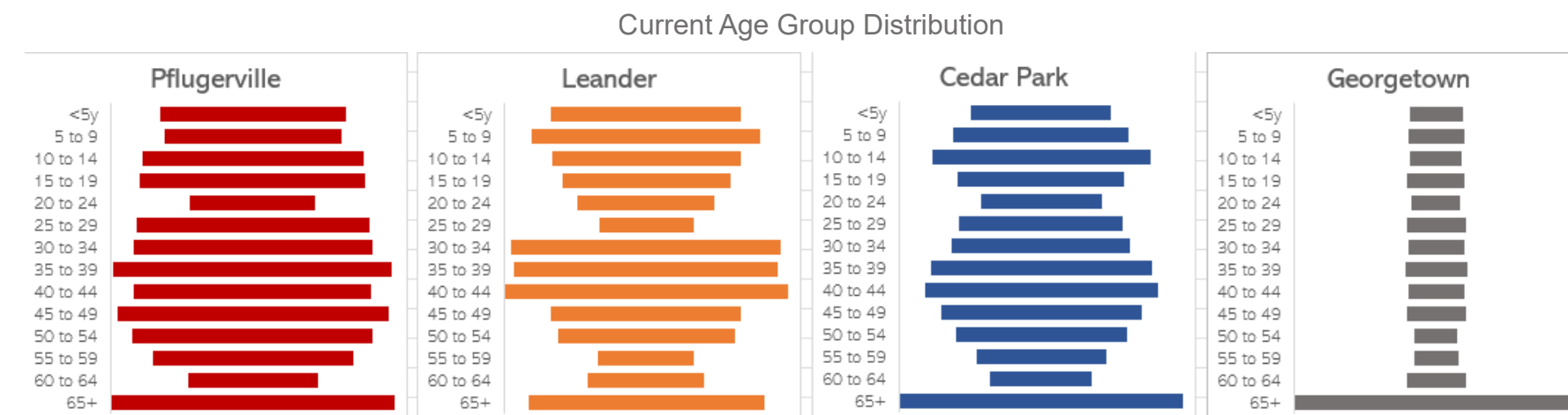
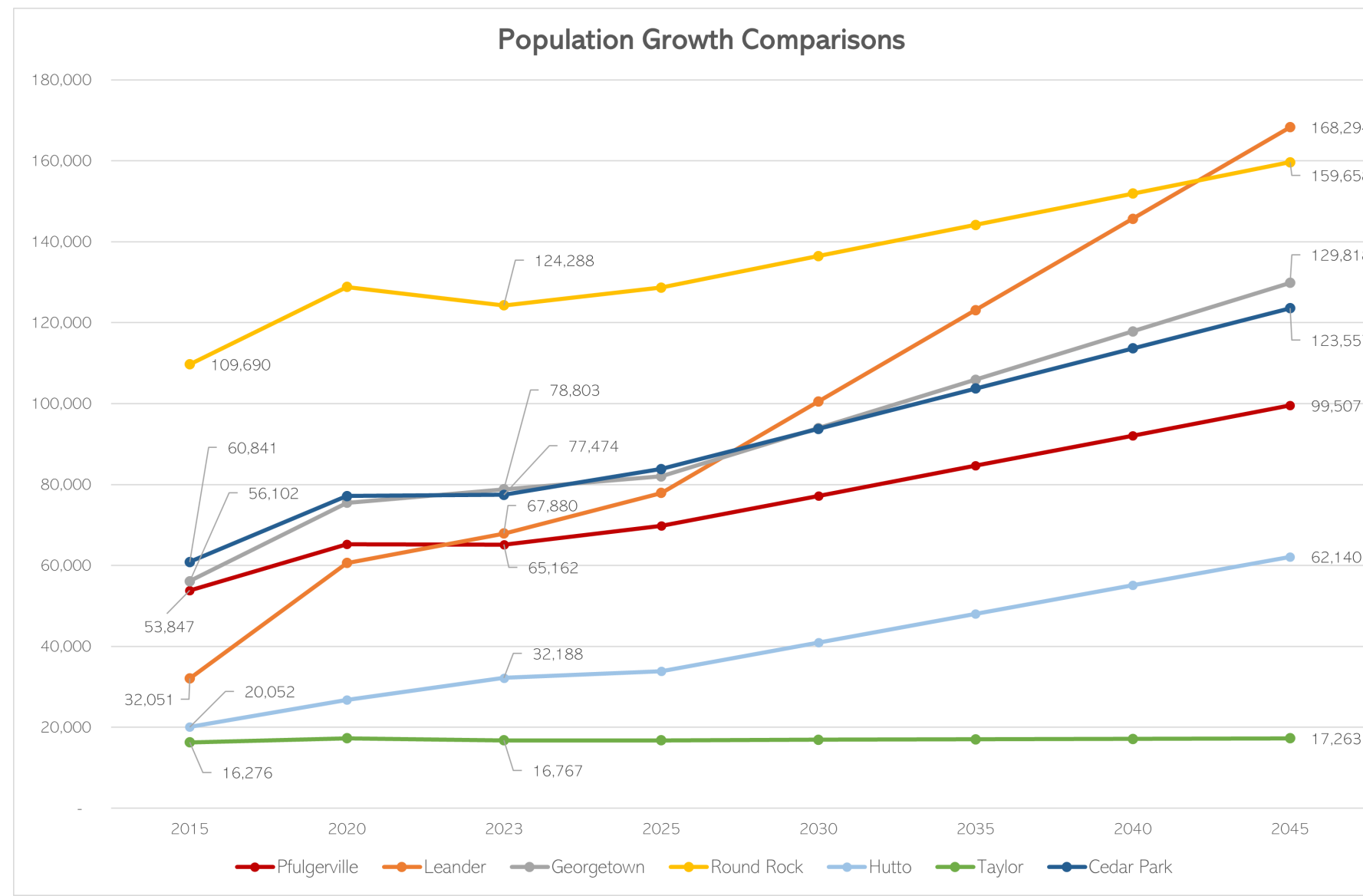
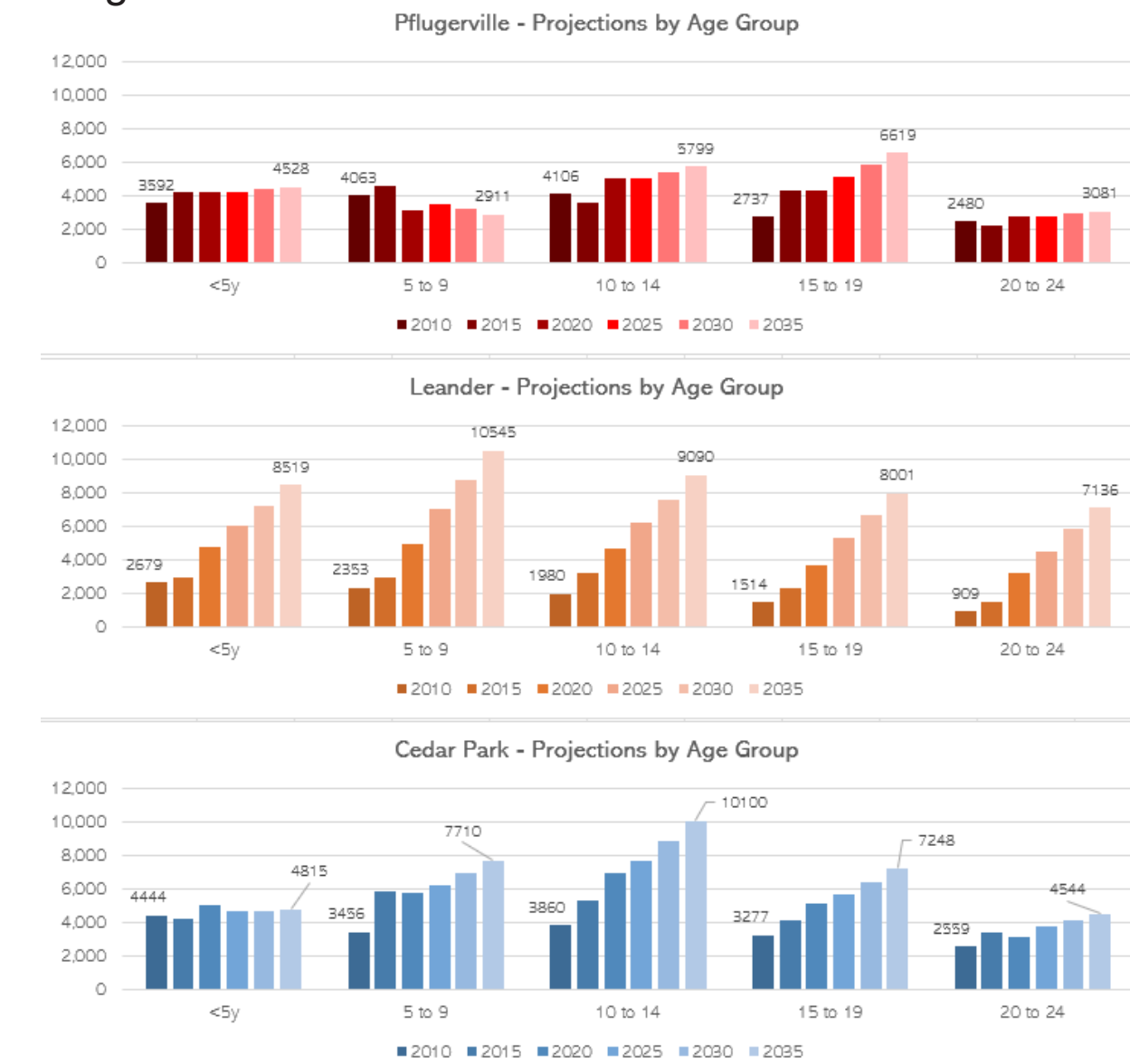
Parkhill conducted a study based on the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) standards and Pflugerville's projected population growth to show recreational facilities demand within the city. According to the study, Pflugerville faces a substantial shortage of outdoor recreational amenities, with the greatest demand for baseball fields, softball fields, tennis courts, pickleball courts, soccer fields, and rectangular fields.

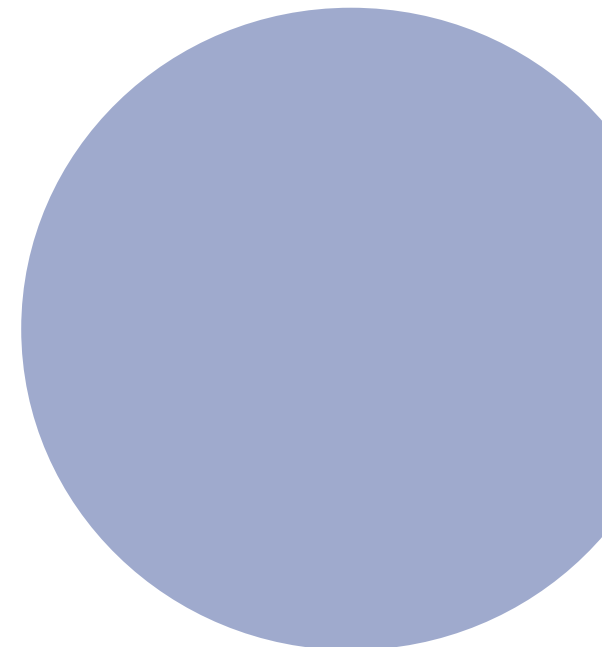

Public Engagement

- The Process:** Stakeholder interviews are an essential component of the feasibility study process, providing critical qualitative data to inform the feasibility report. These interviews involve engaging with key individuals and organizations who have a vested interest in the project's outcome, such as the sports associations mentioned. The purpose of these discussions is to identify needs, priorities, considerations, and potential challenges from multiple perspectives. Insights gathered through stakeholder interviews help ensure that the feasibility analysis is comprehensive, accurately reflects stakeholder expectations, and supports the development of practical and well-informed recommendations.
- Diverse Participation:** These organizations collectively serve a wide demographic, from youth (PAYSL, Pflugerville Force, PAYBAS, Austin Ultimate Youth) to adults (ATCL, Austin Ultimate Adult) and seniors (Austin Ultimate Seniors), with thousands of players involved in soccer, cricket, tackle/flag football, cheer, ultimate frisbee, baseball, and softball.
- Pflugerville Residency:** A significant portion of players are Pflugerville residents, ranging from approximately 50% in ATCL, 70% in PAYSL, 90% in Pflugerville Force, and 80-85% in PAYBAS, demonstrating a strong local engagement.
- Facility Usage & Needs:** Northeast Metropolitan Park is a key shared location, but all organizations express a need for improved and expanded facilities. This includes more dedicated field space (soccer, football, baseball, softball, cricket), better lighting, scoreboards, spectator seating, batting cages, concessions, storage, and restrooms, with specific requests for consolidating fields in one location for practice and games.
- Growth & Demand:** All associations report consistent or increasing growth, with some, like Pflugerville Force, turning away participants due to capacity limitations, highlighting the urgent need for addressing facility and resource constraints.
- Summary:** Pflugerville's public engagement efforts highlight a thriving local sports scene, encompassing a diverse range of organizations like the Austin Tapedball Cricket League, Pflugerville Force, Austin Ultimate, PAYSL, and PAYBAS. All of these associations are experiencing consistent growth and feature significant participation from Pflugerville residents, yet they universally face challenges related to inadequate sports facilities. There's a pressing need for more dedicated field space, enhanced lighting, scoreboards, batting cages and essential amenities such as concessions, and restrooms, particularly as some organizations are already turning away participants. There is an urgent need for collaborative solutions and infrastructure development to support the community's expanding athletic interests.

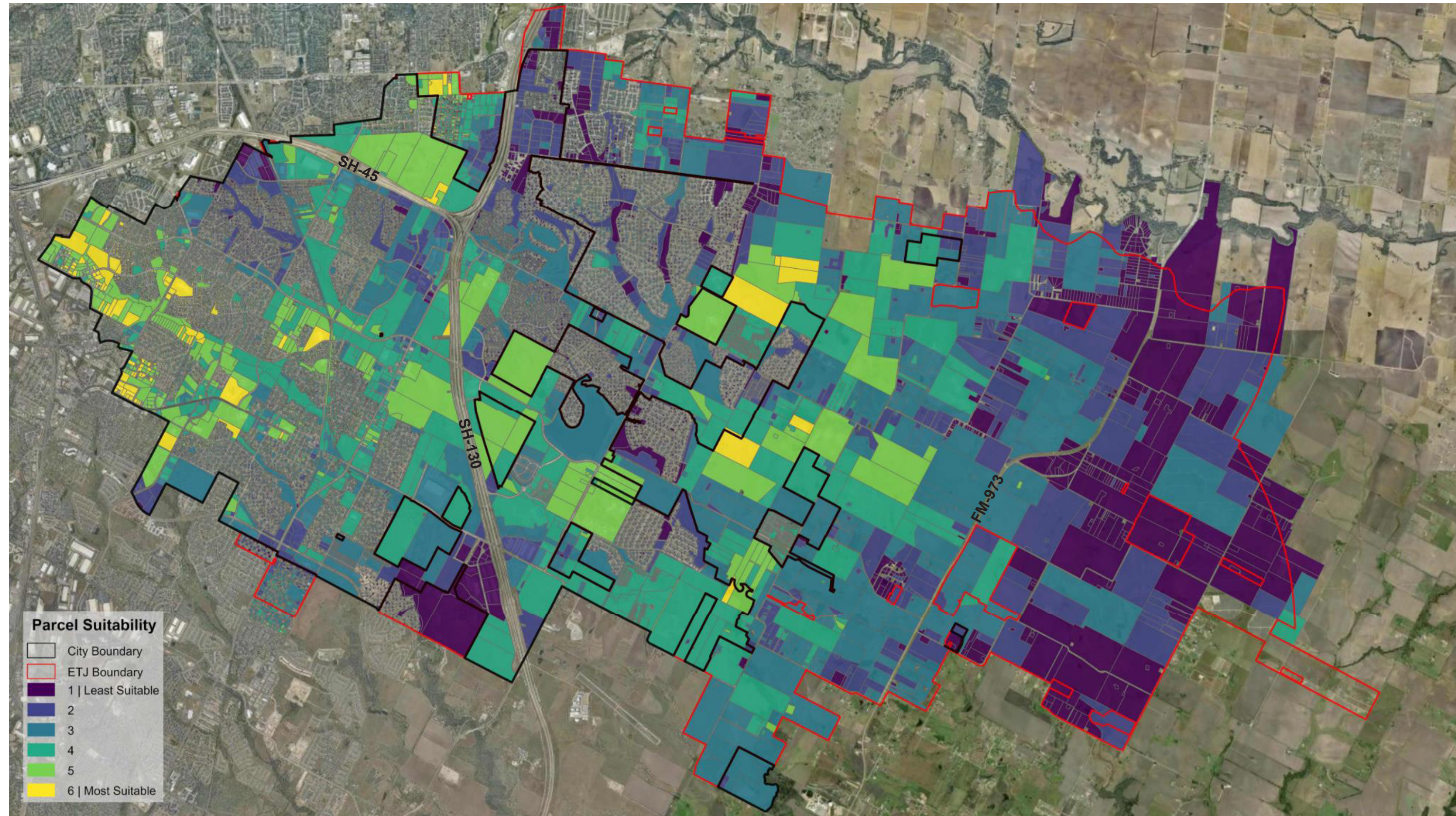

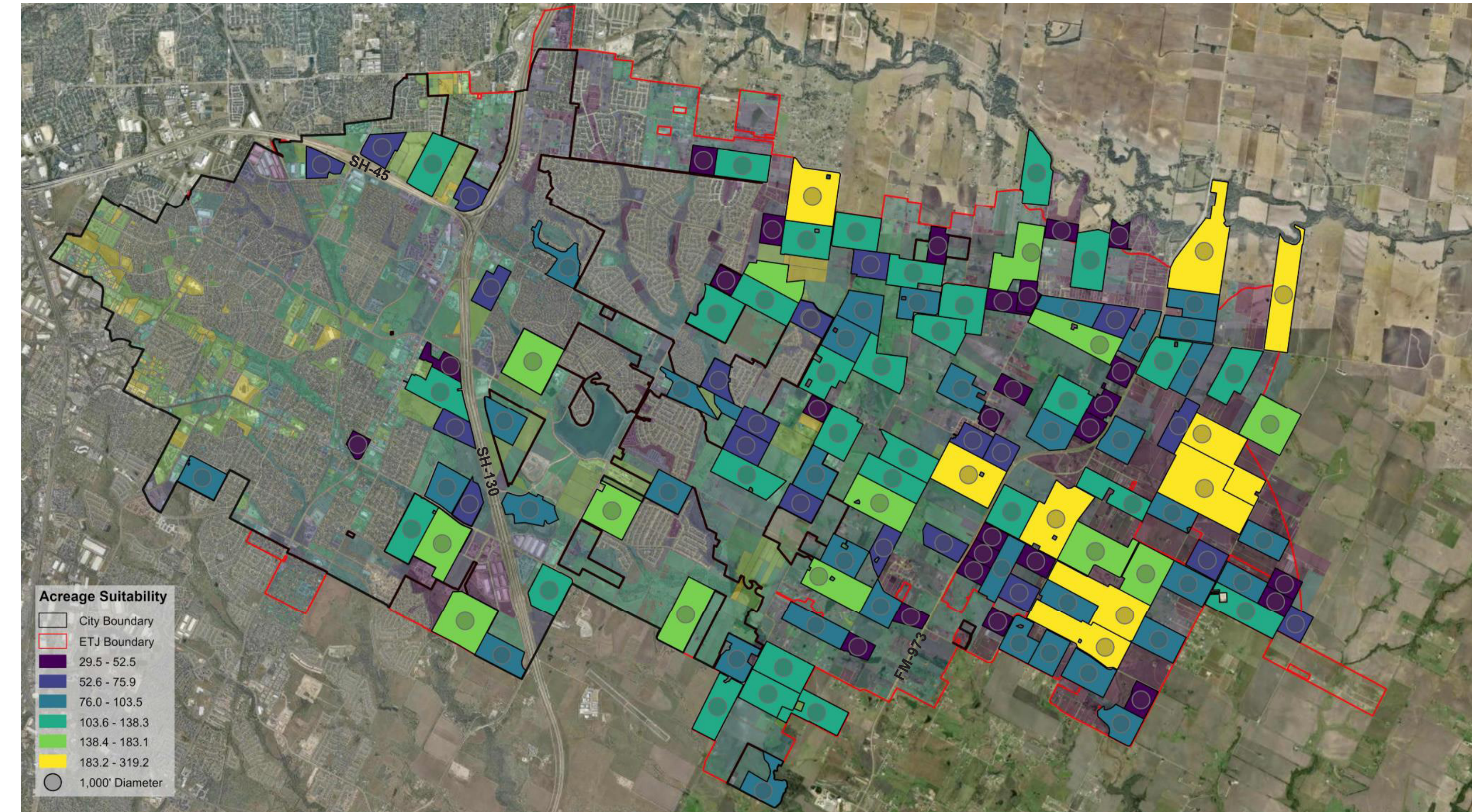

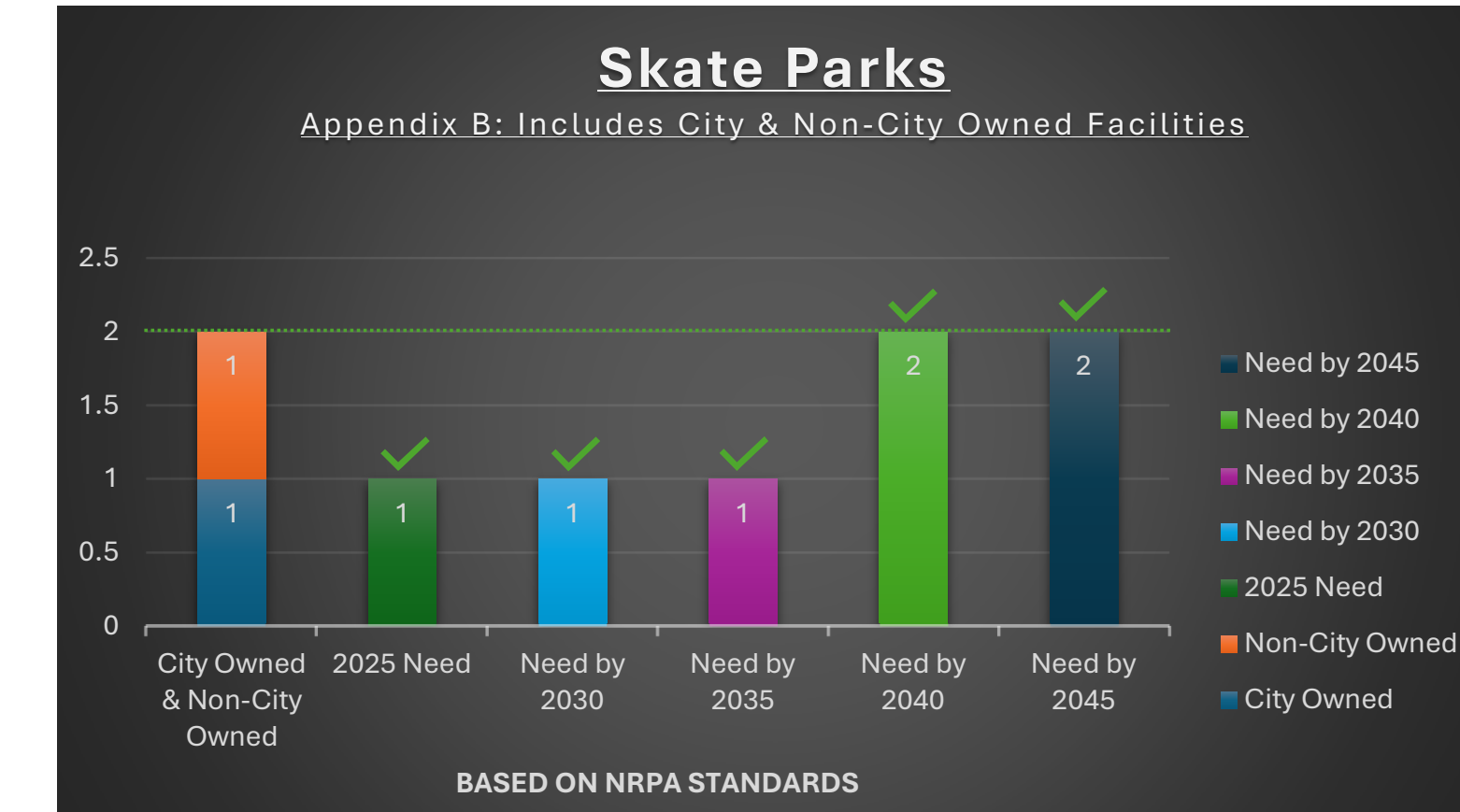

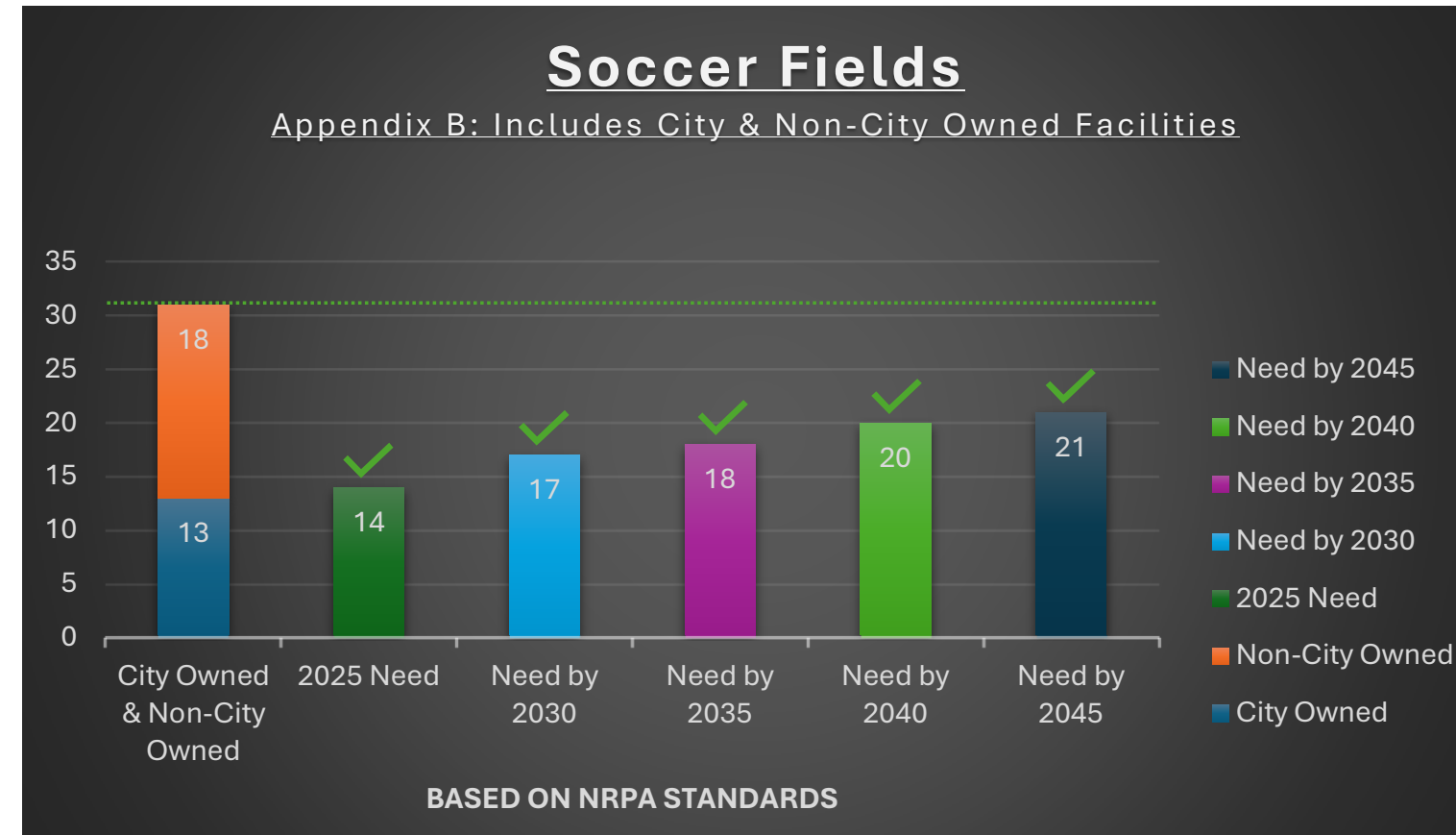
