Re: Consider for approval a resolution authorizing the City Manager to apply for and accept, if awarded, a 2022 First Responder Mental Health Program Grant award for \$13,030.00 from the Office of the Governor for the enhancement of the current Police Resiliency Program for Department staff. The funding will support health programs, peer support training, stress training for officers and civilian staff and a staff library which will provide literature pertaining to job related stress and PTSD. There is a 20% matching fund requirement which will be met with salary and fringe of the Lieutenant overseeing the program. Approval is also requested to authorize the City Manager to sign all necessary documents upon final approval of the City Attorney.

I. <u>Background</u>

- A. The Pflugerville Police Department currently operates a police resiliency program, which was implemented in 2018.
- B. The funding will assist in enhancing the services provided to staff.
- C. This is the third year of grant funding to support this program, if awarded.

II. <u>Current Situation</u>

- A. The Police Department seeks funding assistance from the fiscal year 2022 First Responder Mental Health Program Grant of \$13,030.00.
- B. Deadline for filing the application with the Office of the Governor is February 11, 2021.
- C. In the fourth quarter of 2021 the City will be notified by the Office of the Governor of the award approval decision.
- D. To access the grant funding, City Council must authorize the City Manager to apply for and accept the grant award if received.

WHEREAS, The City of Pflugerville City Council finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Pflugerville, Texas that the Pflugerville Police Department – Police Resiliency Project be enhanced for the year fiscal year 2022; and
