

WASHING MACHINE REBATE

City of Pflugerville residential water customers may apply for one (1) rebate per household by supplying proof of purchase and installation of a high efficiency washing machine at the household for which the rebate is being applied.

- a) Washing machines eligible for rebate are only those on the Consortium for Energy Efficiency (CEE) Super Efficient Home Appliances Initiative Clothes Washer Qualifying Product List. This list is updated monthly on the CCE website.
- b) Maximum rebate amount – seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).

PFLOURISHING FLORA REBATE

City of Pflugerville residential water customers may apply for a rebate when removing turf-grass from an existing lawn area. Customers in good standing may apply once per calendar year and must remove a minimum of 500 square feet of turf-grass per application.

- a) Rebate is for the removal of all types of turf-grass subsequently replaced with drought-tolerant and native plants only.
- b) Irrigation system spray or rotor heads in the area where the turf-grass is removed must be permanently capped.
- c) Eligible Pflourishing Flora projects:
 - a. are pre-approved by City Staff;
 - b. have a minimum of fifty percent (50%) plant cover at plant maturity;
 - c. include plant beds that are top dressed in at least 2 inches of mulch;
- d) A pre-inspection of the project location and a post inspection of the project must be conducted by City Staff.
- e) Permeable hardscape is permitted but cannot exceed 3 feet in width.
- f) Impermeable hardscape is not permitted and will render the project ineligible for the rebate.
- g) Maximum rebate amount – two thousand dollars (\$2000) per household, and in accordance with the following:
 - I. One dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25) per square foot of turf-grass removed; and,
 - II. Total amount of rebate cannot exceed the cost of project installation.
 - III. Installation must be pre-approved by City of Pflugerville staff before commencing and inspected upon completion.

RAINWATER HARVESTING REBATE

City of Pflugerville residential water customers may apply for a rebate by submitting proof of purchase and installation of rainwater harvesting systems. Customers in good standing may apply once per calendar year.

- a) Rebate is for the installation of a new system or the expansion of an existing system. Used or self-made barrels are not eligible.
- b) Eligible rain barrels must:
 - a. have an internal liner to prevent sunlight from penetrating the tank, or in the case of barrels made from galvanized metal or wood to prevent rusting or rotting;

- b. have screens on opening to prevent debris, insects, or animals from entering the barrel;
 - c. have an overflow pipe directing water away from the base of barrel to prevent erosion or flooding;
 - d. be on a level pad site made of concrete, gravel, or sand.
- c) Rainwater collected shall only be used for non-potable purposes and not connected to the City's water supply.
- d) An itemized receipt must be submitted with the application within 30-days of installation. Receipt must include date, vendor name and address, amount paid, and the capacity of the installed barrel.
- e) Maximum rebate amount – six hundred dollars (\$600) per household, and in accordance with the following:
- i. Fifty cent (\$0.50) per gallon of storage capacity, not to exceed barrel purchase price, and
 - ii. Fifty percent (50%) of the purchase of pad material, overflow, first flush, and pump, and
 - iii. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the cost of downspout gutters installed for the rainwater collection system. Gutters that are not connected to the rainwater collection system are ineligible for a rebate.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM REBATE (PROPOSED)

City of Pflugerville residential water customers may apply for a rebate by submitting proof of disabling an entire irrigation system or when permanently capping an irrigation zone that was previously in use. Customers in good standing may apply once per calendar year. Customers are eligible for the Irrigation System rebate for the proof of:

- a) Disabling entire irrigation system via the removal of the backflow device, backflow box, all visible zone valve and boxes, and the system controller. Any connection to the customers service line must be removed and appropriately capped.
- b) Permanently capping of an entire irrigation zone via the removal and capping of an existing zone valve and box. All visible sprinkler heads must be removed. Zone area must have been converted to an area that no longer requires regular irrigation, such as native plant beds or hardscape. Conversion of a zone to drip line irrigation is not eligible for the rebate.
- c) Maximum rebate amount – one thousand dollars (\$1000) per household, and in accordance with the following:
 - i. Entirely disabled irrigation systems are eligible for the full rebate amount, OR
 - ii. Individual irrigation zones disabled are eligible for seventy-five dollars (\$75) per zone disabled not to exceed the maximum rebate amount.
