1. Call to order

Mayor Pro Tem Omar Peña called the worksession to order at 6:00 p.m. Councilmembers Doug Weiss, Jeff Marsh, Rudy Metayer, Mike Heath and Jim McDonald were in attendance. Mayor Victor Gonzales was absent. 2A. <u>2019-7665</u> Presentation of the proposed FY20 budget.

Ms. Breland provided an overview of the proposed budget and answered questions of the Council. Ms. Good provided input. There was discussion on the item.

2B.2019-7669Discussion regarding the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning
Organization (CAMPO) Regional Arterials Study, the MoKan/Northeast
Subregional Plan and the Transportation Demand Management Plan.

Ms. Barron presented on the item and answered questions of Council. She noted that she and Chad Wood serve on the Steering Committee. Mr. Wood explained that the study only provides a system of ideas and concepts to be used if a government chooses to sponsor a project, that it does not provide a true plan. Mr. Marsh stated that he likes the superbike path suggested by Mr. Heath years ago for the MoKan. Mr. Heath noted a committee he served on in the past to address making communities more walkable and comments that were submitted are not noted. He stated a need to address FM 685. Mr. Metayer stated that it would make more sense there. Mr. Heath indicated a need to address connectivity. Council discussion continued. Staff was to bring back a draft resolution for the Council to consider to provide the Council's positions of support and opposition regarding the Regional Arterials Study, the MoKan/Northeast Subregional Plan and the Transportation Demand Management Plan to be presented to CAMPO in August.

3. Adjourn

Mr. Marsh made a motion to close the worksession. Mr. Metayer seconded the motion. The vote was Mr. Weiss-yes, Mr. Marsh-yes, Mayor Pro Tem Peña-yes, Mr. Metayer-yes, Mr. Heath-no, Mr. McDonald-yes. The motion carried. The worksession was adjourned at 6:45 p.m.
