The 144 MWac Pflugerville Solar Project, owned by Recurrent Energy, is expected to generate enough low-cost clean electricity to power the equivalent of approximately 25,000 Austin-area homes annually.

Updates on the Pflugerville Solar Project



We are pleased to announce that construction has started on the Pflugerville Solar Project! Given the recent construction activity at the project site, we thought it would be helpful to provide you with a detailed overview of what is actually taking place.

Gravel trucks are making deliveries and we anticipate them to continue for the next four to six weeks. Mounting equipment deliveries have and will continue for the next two to three months; and lastly, we expect cable deliveries to continue for approximately three more weeks. Solar panel deliveries are planned to start the week of September 28th and will continue through January 2021. Please note that construction plans can change due to local weather and around the state.

You may see our suppliers and vendors using Manda Carlson Road coming from US 290 in order to avoid using Sandeen Road and New Sweden Road to make deliveries.

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Pflugerville Solar to Power Austin Area Homes

Recurrent Energy signed a Power Purchase Agreement ("PPA") with Austin Energy in 2018 for the Pflugerville Solar Project to provide low-cost solar power to the utility's customers for 15 years following the start of operation. This PPA supports Austin Energy's renewable energy goals which commit the utility to cost-effectively reduce emissions and includes plans to exit from its coal-fired power generation by the end of 2022. Austin Energy serves more than 500,000 customers in the City of Austin, as well as several neighboring areas of Travis County and Williamson County.

Pflugerville Solar Will Support The Local Community Over the Long-Term

The Pflugerville Solar Project is expected to create long-term permanent jobs to support the operation and maintenance of the power plant, as well as more than 350 construction jobs of which at least 50% will be performed by local workers. The project will also have a positive economic impact on the local community by providing tax revenues for Travis County and the Elgin ISD; the total economic impact of which will be approximately \$350 million throughout the life of the project.
