The Library took a break from children's programs in August in order to prepare for the upcoming year. Adult programs continued as usual. Special programs this month celebrated the solar eclipse. Adult Services Librarian Bette McDowell planned for more than six months for a series of events.

During the Maker Pfest event, a virtual reality station was available with our Viewmaster VR viewers. Viewers could be used to get a glimpse of planets, constellations and spacecraft.

Thursday, July 13, Ms. Amanda read solar-themed books, and children can completed a fun craft.

August 11th featured an indoor planetarium courtesy of Pat McCord. Guests were able to visit outer space, explore the galaxy and land on the moon and Mars. This program attracted more than 250 people.

Finally on August 21st, more than 700 free eclipse viewing glasses were made available courtesy of StarNet. The event started with a short informational session on safe viewing. Then participants could take their glasses outside to view the eclipse. A craft was available for those who did not get glasses.
