Joint Meeting

1. Call to Order

Mayor Doug Weiss called the meeting to order at 6:01. Mayor Pro Tem Kimberly Holiday and Councilmembers Melody Ryan, Jonathan Coffman, and Cesar Ruiz were in attendance. Councilmembers David Rogers and Rudy Metayer joined the meeting at 6:03pm.

2. Public Comment

Toni Henton spoke about the Historic Colored Addition history and discussed ensuring the legacy was preserved. Ms. Henton discussed honoring the truth, ensuring future generations have the history, and urged partnership in preservation initiatives.

Melanie Manwell discussed concerns about engaging with the community, leadership, oversight, and accountability. Ms. Manwell stated there is not consistency in rules across schools and stated people need to be held accountable.

Jenna Bulwick stated she is a cemetery conservator and discussed the importance of local history. Ms. Bulwick discussed the Historic Colored Addition and stated it is possible there are additional burials beyond the property line. Ms. Bulwick stated it would be helpful if the ISD can provide any property records for the adjacent land.

Lily Milliner discussed the importance of history for future generations and thanked council for their action on Historic Colored Addition preservation. Ms. Milliner discussed the importance of collaboration to teach and share for the next generation.

Tony Hanson discussed making sure everyone has a voice and his history with the city. Mr. Hanson stated the ISD has shown it values preserving local history

and asked for partnership for Historic Colored Addition beautification.

Maria DeJesus Dixon discussed the history of Pflugerville. Ms. DeJesus Dixon stated preserving history creates opportunity to belong and discussed honoring the history of the city.
