Director's Updates including information about the Project Status Report, Monthly Departmental Financials and Upcoming Special Events.

Mr. Owens introduced the topic. Ms. Dryden began with an update on the ongoing November 2014 Bond Election funded projects—Wilbarger Creek Park design is nearing completion and we intend to go out for bids in early 2018. The final trail gap segment was completed and this last gap completes the \$1 Million November 2014 Bond project. The Bohl's House Renovation Project has been put on hold—City Council chose not to proceed with the project and did not award a bid and also rejected all bids. Discussion on Council determining use of Bohl's house, and how moving staff to another office was the first step in improvements and renovations to be made at the Recreation Center. Gilleland Creek Pool Renovation bids were opened last week and we hope for it to be awarded in January. Stone Hill Park is nearing completion and we're projecting an early 2018 completion. 1849 Park Phase 1A construction was completed in early December, Phase 1B project contract was awarded in late November and construction is expected to begin in January. Ms. Holman then gave a brief review of the Pfestival of Lights event held on Saturday, December 2. Ms. Holman stated that we had an estimated 4,000 guests attend and 48 floats in the parade. Our next event is the Pfreeze Pflop at Scott Mentzer Pool. The event will be held on January 1 on 10am and admission is 1 canned food item.

Mr. Capetillo made a comment about how Pflugerville neighborhoods was very involved with National Night Out events, and he wanted to see how Parks and Recreation can be more involved in the event.
