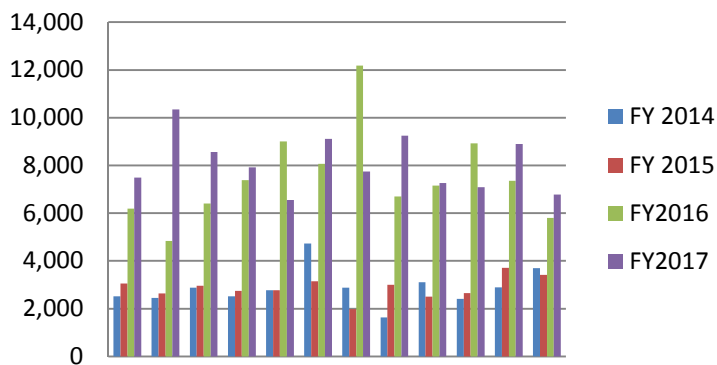

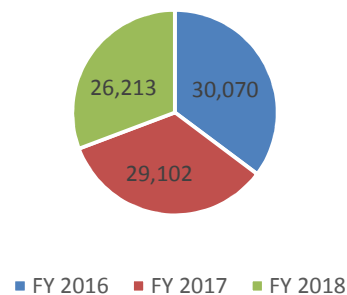

Over the past 5 years the decline in print checkouts have correlated to the rise in eResource checkouts. It seems to be slowing down to some extent with the average print circulations per year for the past three years remaining approximately the same and the average eResource checkouts still growing yearly (albeit at a slower pace than they had previously done).

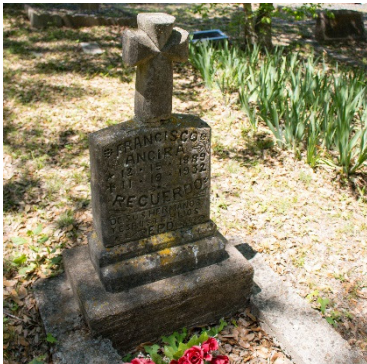
presented on bilingual storytimes. Other staff members participated on professional committees during the conference.
