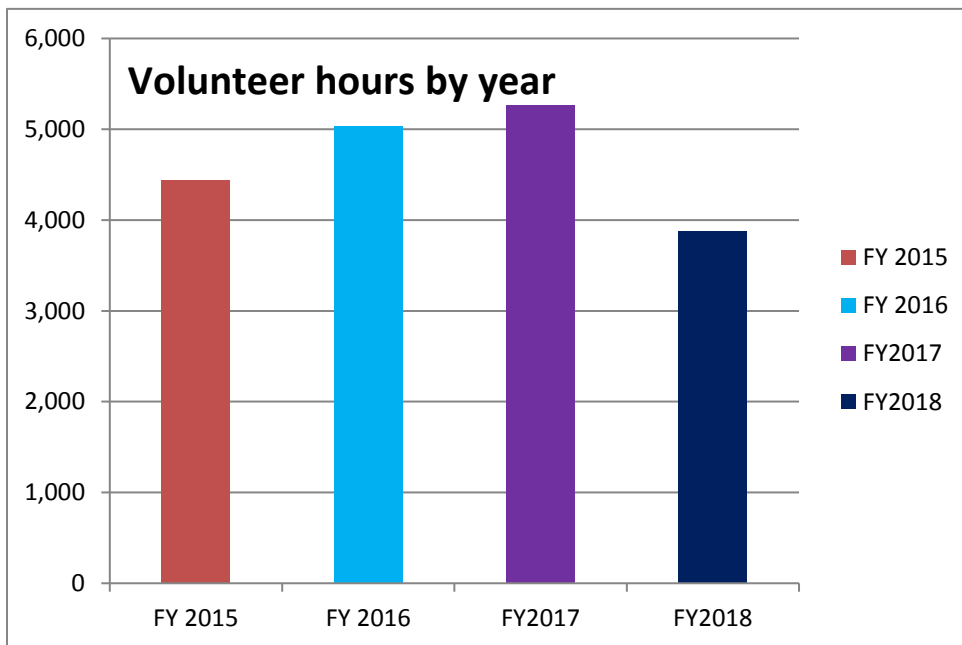

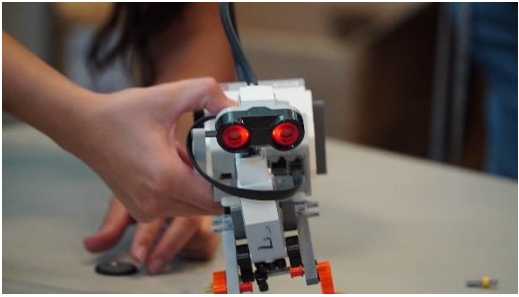

Volunteers average approximately 4900 hours per year. This means our volunteers work the equivalent of nearly two and a half full time staff members saving the city over \$75,000 (based on the average full time salary multiplied by two).

This year, volunteer hours are .06% higher YTD than last year.
