## **Mini Horse Petting Zoo for Adults**

Far and away the best program was the Mini Horse Petting Zoo for Adults. Mini horses from the North Wind Horse Farm were available for adults only. The library often provides adults with animal programs. According to the Anxiety and Depression Association of America, pets and therapy animals can help alleviate stress, anxiety, depression, and feelings of loneliness and social isolation. Interactions with animals can help people manage their long-term mental health conditions.

## Heritage House Museum

The museum presented a special traveling exhibit produced by Humanities Texas, the state affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities from July 3 to August 7. "Lone Star and Eagle" focused on the German immigrants who began settling Central Texas during the 1840s, imparting a distinctive character to these communities. The display featured reproductions of archival photographs, newspaper headlines, maps and paintings.

The Museum also hosted the second annual photography contest. Entries were on display at the library and winners announce at the end of the month. Winners received an Ancestry DNA kit and the winning photographs are currently on display at the Heritage House Museum.
