### Industrial Pretreatment Program

#### **Need for Pretreatment Program**

Publicly Owned Treatment Works (POTW)



"Protect POTW from toxic or non-conventional pollutants from industrial wastewater discharges"


#### Objectives:

- Prevent POTW <u>interference</u> (inhibition or upset of wastewater treatment process)
  - ✓ Protect investment made on the new biological treatment process at Central WWTP
- Prevent <u>pass-through</u> of pollutants
  - ✓ Maintain discharge permit compliance at all times
- Improve opportunities to <u>recycle</u> and <u>reclaim</u> municipal wastewater and sludge
  - ✓ Maintain quality of treated effluent and biosolids
- Equitable distribution of cost of treatment
  - Revenue from high strength wastewater dischargers (surcharge program)




Envirofacts map showing IUs in the City of Pflugerville

#### **Need for Surcharge Fees:**


- <u>Equitable distribution</u> of cost of treatment at WWTP
- Revenue from industries discharging high strength wastewater
- Encourage industries to implement pretreatment

"DOMESTIC" OR BASELINE POLLUTANT LEVELS,



Sewer Blockages due to FOG




## Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) Program

#### **Sewer Overflows Can Impact Our Community**

- Sewer back-up affects people and businesses
- Sewer overflows cause:
  - Sewer line cleaning & flushing
  - Containment, removal, & disposal of spill & contaminated materials
  - Traffic Control
- Fine & Penalties
- Fish-kills
- Violation of State and Federal Laws











## Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) Program

- Establish criteria for proper sizing of grease traps, installation, cleaning and maintenance
- Food Service Establishments (FSEs) survey and inventory
- FOG Ordinance
- Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for implementation of FOG program
- Separate from Pretreatment ordinance

#### **An Effective FOG Program will:**

- Protect collection system
  - Reduce damage to manholes, sewer pipes, and sewer pump stations
- Prevent expensive sewer overflows
  - Avoid regulatory fines and penalties
- Prevent sewer back-ups
  - Homes and businesses, avoid "bad" public relations
- Protect public health, safety, and environment
  - Reduce exposure to disease and potential for fish-kills
  - Protect drinking water



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
