Discuss and consider action to approve the minutes from the Parks and Recreation Commission April 19, 2018 Regular Meeting.

Ms. Castillo made a motion to approve the minutes as presented from the April 19, 2018 regular meeting. Mr. Owens seconded the motion. All were in favor. The motion was approved.

#### 4. Discuss Only

#### **4A.** 2018-6785

Director's Updates including information about the Project Status Report, Monthly Departmental Financials and Upcoming Special Events.

Ms. Crouch introduced the topic. Ms. Dryden began with an update on the 1849 Park and showed a photo of the progress on the concession building going in near the football fields and a photo of the sidewalk going in around the football fields. The multi-purpose building pad has been prepped as well. This project has a late Summer completion date. Last Saturday 36 trees were planted with the Rotary Club in 1849 Park. Stone Hill Park official opening is being held up by electrical and plumbing permitting and some additional drainage and vegetation levels issues need to be accessed also. Wilbarger Creek Park will go out to bid in Summer with a projected early 2019 completion date. Gilleland Creek Pool reconstruction project is ahead of schedule and they are planning to refill the pool in the next few days. The construction fencing was removed at Pfluger Park and a ribbon cutting is scheduled for Friday, May 18 at 9:30 a.m. Discussion began on social media feedback on new playground in Pfluger Park. Mr. Hemenes mentioned that as part of FY19 budget requests for CIP funding include additional playground replacement funding, additional vehicles and storage. Mr. Hemenes continued to say that the new Recreation Center/Senior Center feasibility study is being worked on and that a RFQ for Lake Pflugerville will go out next week. The next upcoming events are Deutschen Pfest and the weekly Pfarmers Market each Tuesday through October, and a new part of the market, the Market Meet-Up, will take place each first Tuesday of the month during the market. KIDFISH will be held on Saturday, June 2 at Lake Pflugerville's south shore. Pfirecracker Pfestival at the Pfield will be on Wednesday, July 4 starting at 5 p.m.

#### **4B**. 2018-6787

Staff Report and discussion regarding Volunteer & Community Services.

Ms. Crouch introduced the topic. Mr. Eddie Garcia gave a brief presentation on some of the programs he oversees. The presentation included information and photos about the Drop-By-Drop Rebate Program, the Pfarmers Market, and the extensive Volunteer Program that Mr. Garcia coordinates. Mr. Garcia collects statistics from all his various programs that is used in reporting for grants and awards that the city may apply for. Mr. Garcia showed a list and photos of the larger volunteer projects that have been completed in 2018 thus far. About 3500 volunteers have participated in a program. Mr. Garcia also manages the weekly Pfarmers Market May through October, with special market dates in March, April, November, and December as well. The market averages 24 vendors per week, with 38 unique vendors.
