1. Call to order

Mayor Victor Gonzales called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held by telephone/video conference. Mayor Pro Tem Omar Peña and Councilmembers Doug Weiss, Ceasar Ruiz, Mike Heath and David Rogers

were in attendance. 2. Items of Community Interest

Mayor Gonzales stated that it was with sadness that he learned of the passing of Ron Davis. Mayor Gonzales observed a moment of silence in remembrance and to honor Mr. Davis for his public service to Travis County and the community.

Mayor Gonzales announced that today Austin Public Health moved to Stage 4 and that the Library had reopened the courtyard for public use.

3A. <u>2021-0151</u> Mayor's proclamation declaring February 2021 as Black History Month.

Mayor Gonzales welcomed and recognized the members of the Equity Commission in attendance for the reading of the proclamation. He provided comments on the Equity Commission and thanked the members for their efforts. He read the proclamation.

3B. <u>2021-0089</u> Presentation of the quarterly report and discussion about the City's Capital Improvement Program.

Ms. Davis presented and answered questions of Council.

3C. <u>2021-0143</u> Presentation and discussion of FY21-Q1 Financial Results.

Ms. Moore presented and answered questions of Council.

4. Public Comment

Mayor Gonzales stated that registration for public comment was taken until 5:00 p.m. today and there were no requests to provide public comment.

Reading of the Consent Agenda

Items 8A and 8B were removed from the consent agenda. Ms. Thompson read the items to include the captions of the ordinances under consideration.

5. Ordinances First Reading

5A. <u>ORD-0561</u> Approving an annexation ordinance on first reading with the caption: An

ordinance of the City of Pflugerville, Texas, annexing, for full purposes, tracts of land totaling approximately 5.205 acres situated in the Joseph Wiehl Survey No. 8, Abstract No. 802, Travis County, Texas, of the Real Property Records of Travis County, being one tract of land totaling 4.724 acres and the second tract of land totaling 0.481 acres representing the abutting Jesse Bohls Road right-of-way; generally located along the west side of Weiss Lane at the intersection of Jesse Bohls Road; extending the boundaries of the City to include land; and to be zoned Agriculture / Development Reserve (A); to be known as the 17705 Weiss Lane 2021 Annexation; binding the land to all of the acts, ordinances, resolutions and regulations of the City; approving a service plan; providing for severability; and providing an effective date.

The ordinance was approved on first reading on the consent agenda.

6. Ordinances Second Reading

6A. ORD-0563 Approving an ordinance on second reading with the caption reading: An ordinance of the City of Pflugerville, Texas, amending Ordinance No. 1203-15-02-24 of the City of Pflugerville, Texas, as amended by changing the zoning designation of an approximate 48.126 acre-tract of land located at the southeast corner of the E Pflugerville Pkwy and Wilke Ridge Ln intersection along the south side of E Pflugerville Pkwy, from Retail (R) and General Business 1 (GB1) district to Planned Unit Development (PUD) district; to be known as the Hill Country Bible Church PUD Rezoning (REZ2008-01); providing for repeal of conflicting ordinances; providing for severability; and providing an effective date.

The ordinance was approved on second and final reading on the consent agenda.

6B. ORD-0567 Approving an ordinance on second reading with the caption reading: Ordinance of The City of Pflugerville, Texas, amending the City of Pflugerville, Texas Code of Ordinances, Chapter 72 by supplementing Schedule III to provide for additional Stop Signs on City streets, providing for a penalty for a violation of Chapter 72 as a Class C misdemeanor and a fine in an amount not to exceed \$200.00; repealing all ordinances to the extent they are in conflict; providing for severability; and providing an effective date.

The ordinance was approved on second and final reading on the consent agenda.

in the amount of \$68,000.00 for right-of-way services associated with the
Weiss Lane/Pecan Street Water Line project.

The item was approved on the consent agenda.

Action on the Consent Agenda

Mayor Gonzales made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Mr. Weiss seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion carried.

Resolutions

8A. <u>RES-0828</u> Approving a resolution establishing a City of Pflugerville Purchasing Policy.

Ms. Moore provided information and answered questions of Council with input from Ms. Breland. Mr. Weiss stated that he thinks it improves transparency. Mr. Metayer and Mayor Pro Tem Peña recommended additional discussion. Mr. Metayer asked to place on the next worksession for discussion. Mr. Rogers stated that this was discussed at the last Finance and Budget Committee meeting and he is fine with it, but if they feel it needs additional review, it is fine with him. Mr. Heath made a motion to postpone with discussion at the next worksession. Mr. Rogers seconded the motion. All voted in favor. The motion carried.

8B. <u>RES-0829</u> Approving a resolution authorizing the City Manager or authorized designee the authority to execute contracts as approved in the budget in an amount up to \$50,000, and for contracts specifically approved in the authorized purchase list approved by City Council in the annual budget in the maximum amount of \$200,000.
Mayor Pro Tem Peña stated that he would also like to postpone item 8B. Ms.

Mayor Pro Tem Pena stated that he would also like to postpone item 8B. Ms. Breland stated that the city currently does not provide a limit and these purchases are allowed by state law. She asked for a suggested limit. Discussion followed. Mr. Weiss confirmed with Ms. Breland that these purchases would be specifically noted in the budget and stated that he was comfortable with it as proposed. Mayor Pro Tem Peña recommended a limit of \$50,000. Ms. Breland stated that she is happy to bring this item back with item 8A, noting that they should be considered together. No action was taken.

10. Discuss and consider action

10A. <u>2021-0042</u> Discuss and consider action to approve a proposal to facilitate strategic planning efforts with the City Council and authorizing the City Manager to execute documents.

Mr. Fletcher provided information and recommended hiring facilitator Blake Alexander. Mr. Alexander provided information on the proposal for facilitated sessions leading to a tangible strategy. Mayor Gonzales provided comments on his confidence in Mr. Alexander. Mr. Metayer stated he thinks it is great and he is looking forward to it. Mr. Weiss made a motion to approve the item. Mayor Gonzales seconded the motion. Mr. Rogers stated that he does not understand it and therefore voted no. All others voted in favor. The motion carried.

11. Discuss only

11A.2021-0170Discussion regarding Sorento MUD (Travis County MUD 17)
development and infrastructure proposal.

The item was discussed at the worksession.

11B. 2021-0134Discussion regarding the American's with Disabilities Act (ADA)
Transition Plan.

Erin Eurek continued her presentation from the worksession and answered questions of Council. Ms. Davis provided input. There was discussion on the item.
