Approving a resolution with the caption reading: A Resolution of the City of Pflugerville, Texas Accepting a Stormwater Facilities Maintenance Covenant, License and Agreement for Basis Pflugerville Charter School Pond Maintenance between Basis Texas Charter Schools (“Owner”) and the City of Pflugerville (“City”). (Located at the northeast corner of 10th Street and Wells Branch Parkway)

The Basis Pflugerville Charter School development project will incorporate an aboveground detention pond to detain storm water runoff from the property. This agreement between Basis Texas Charter Schools and the City of Pflugerville spells out the owner's responsibility to maintain the facilities in perpetuity. Inspection and maintenance will be the sole responsibility of the property owner; however, in the event the system is not being properly maintained, this agreement gives the City the right to enter the property and perform any inspection, monitoring, operation, maintenance, replacement, upgrade or repair necessary for the duration of such activities and allows for the City to recover the costs associated with such actions. Reference Part III, Section B.4.b.3 of the General TPDES (Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System), Phase II Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit, which requires that the City require the owner or operator of any new development or redeveloped site to develop and implement a maintenance plan addressing maintenance requirements for any structural control measures installed on site.

This Resolution authorizes City Manager Signature on the proposed pond maintenance agreement.
